We have lots of new members in the club. The only way they will be able to remember your name is if you wear your CCU name badge. To encourage


you, only members wearing naming tags will get raffle tickets for the Membership Meeting door prizes. Come on, dig out those badges.


NOT HEARING ABOUT UPCOMING EVENTS




YELLOWSTONE SNOWCOACH TOUR
